What is Coronavirus?

Coronaviruses are a large family of viruses that cause illness ranging from the common cold to more severe diseases like pneumonia, MERS and SARS

SEVERE SYMTOMS

- High Fever (100.4°F or higher)
- Pneumonia
- Kidney failure
- Death

TRANSMISSION

Coughs or sneezes from infected person or touching contaminated objects

COMMON SYMPTOMS

Fever

After 2 to 7 days develop a dry cough

Mild breathing difficulties at the outset

Gastrointestinal issues


Diarrhea

General body aches



Who is at risk for a serious Covid-19 Infection?



Older adults are at highest risk of serious or life-threatening Covid—19 infections.

8 out of 10 COVID-19 deaths reported in the U.S. have been in adults 65 years old and older. Visit CDC.gov/coronavirus for steps to reduce your risk of getting sick.









Covid – 19 Vaccines Save Lives

What we know from large studies of thousands of different people who took the Covid-19 vaccine:



Only 2 to 3 people out of 10 contracted a new case of Covid-19



Only 1 out of 10 people were hospitalized or died from a new Covid-19 infection

Mild Vaccine Reactions are <u>normal</u>

Common COVID-19 Vaccine Side Effects

These side effects of the COVID-19 vaccine may affect your ability to do daily activities, but they should go away in a few days.










In most cases, discomfort from fever or pain is normal. Contact your doctor or healthcare provider:

- If the redness or tenderness where you got the shot increases after 24 hours
- If your side effects are worrying you or do not seem to be going away after a few days

All vaccines work very well to fight off serious Covid-19 infections.







What to expect at the vaccine appointment:



Sit for 15 – 30 minutes

Do I still need to wear a mask?



Yes. The vaccine lowers your chances of getting sick with Covid-19 but does not guarantee it.

Why Should I get the Covid-19 Shot?

Older adults are at high risk for a serious Covid-19 infection that can lead to hospitalization, long-term health problems or death. Older adults who live in long-term care facilities are at the highest risk of having a life-threatening illness.



8 out of 10 of Covid-19 deaths in the United States have been in adults over the age of 65



KNOW your medicines



Prescription



Over-the-Counter (OTC)



Vitamins Supplements



Vaccines

CHOOSE medicines wisely



ACTIVE INGREDIENT

Does this medicine treat what I have now?

USES

Is it safe to take this medicine with my other medical conditions?

WARNING

Can I take this with my other medicines? What are the side effects of this medicine?

DIRECTIONS

How should I take this medicine?

OTHER INFORMATION

How long should I use this medicine?



KEEP medicines out of sight





Follow these simple steps to dispose of medicines in the household trash

MIX

Mix medicines (do not crush tablets or capsules) with an unpalatable substance such as dirt, cat litter, or used coffee grounds;



PLACE

Place the mixture in a container such as a sealed plastic bag;



THROW

Throw the container in your household trash;



SCRATCH OUT

Scratch out all personal information on the prescription label of your empty pill bottle or empty medicine packaging to make it unreadable, then dispose of the container.
