

Requesting Refills from Different Pharmacies in MyChart

When requesting medication refills at the same time, all selected medications will be filled at one pharmacy for your convenience. Follow the steps below if you would like to fill your prescriptions at different pharmacies. Please note this feature is only available for patients who use Johns Hopkins Medicine pharmacies at this time.



Try It Out

1. On the **Renewals** page, make sure that the “Include all refills due soon” box is not checked.
